

## Voter Attitudes after Leaked SCOTUS Decision on *Roe v. Wade*

In the days following the leak of a draft Supreme Court decision overturning *Roe v. Wade*, INTRVL conducted an online poll to assess its potential electoral impact. The poll had a particular emphasis on understanding how overturning *Roe* may change voting behavior among younger voters. The survey was completed in partnership with Up to Us, a Gen-Z-led non-profit.

### Methodology

From May 4-5, 2022, INTRVL conducted an online survey of US adults (n = 450) with a topline margin of error of  $\pm 5.7$  pp, including design effects. INTRVL used multilevel regression and poststratification (MRP) to estimate national opinion levels from the survey sample and account for sampling error and non-response bias. Survey participants' age, gender, race, and previous vote history were included as features in the process.
